General Information

This event is being run in accordance with the British Orienteering guidance for resumption of orienteering in England. In order to participate in this event you must agree to comply with the Participant Code of Conduct.

Important information

- Read the travel/parking information below
- You need to punch the start & finish controls (these will not be SIAC enabled)
- Report to download before 14:00 whether finishing or retiring
- Dress appropriately for the weather conditions. Bring a cagoule in case it is mandatory.

For safety reasons, you must report to registration before going for your run. Maps will be issued at registration FOR ALL COURSES.

Travel Directions, Parking & Assembly

The event is based in the Woodland Trust Carpark, just south of the A69 about 3.5k east of Brampton.

Green	4.2	35
Short Green	3.0	30
Yellow	2.0	25

Pre-entry ONLY for Green and Short Green. Pre-entry preferred for Yellow but limited entry on the day available.

Map

The map is A4 printed on waterproof paper. All courses have a scale of 1:7500. Control descriptions are on the front of the map (pictorial for Green, Short Green, text for Yellow). No loose descriptions will be available.

Terrain

Miltonrigg Wood is a mixed woodland, mostly runnable, with ditch systems and some bramble growth in some areas.

There are a number of fallen trees and the largest are marked on the map as dark green. Where used as control sites, the control description is 'thicket'.

SI Card Hire

If you didn't fill in an SI card number when entering then an SI card will be ready for you to borrow. Go to download to collect it. There is no charge unless you lose it.

Starts

Start blocks are displayed on the [entry list](#) if you need a reminder. Start is 300m from assembly. Follow the marked route. Clear/check will be at the start. Remember to use these before you start. Note that both the start and finish controls must be dibbed, all controls on the course will be SIAC enabled for those with appropriate SI cards. [Courses close at 14:00](#).

If there is a queue at the start wait (at an appropriate distance from your fellow participants) for about 1 minute after the previous person has started on your course. Clear, check (SIAC on) are at the start.

Remember to punch the start.

Finish

You must punch the finish. Results (and Routegadget) will be on the BL website shortly after the event.

Toilets

There will be one portable toilet. If there is a queue please ensure suitable distancing is followed. Remember to sanitise.

First Aid

A First Aid kit will be available at download but please DIY if at all possible to avoid contact.
Local accident and emergency is Cumberland Infirmary, CA2 7HY.

Refreshments

Please bring your own water or other refreshments.

Dogs

Dogs are allowed- leads strongly recommended. Please be aware that this is a popular dog-walking wood and dogs may not be on leads.
